From the Pastor

While spring brings lots of exciting things, such as the prospect of riding scooters, the real excitement is the celebration of the resurrection. In the quiet moments of dawn, when the world whispers the promise of new beginnings, we turn our hearts to the most profound beginning of all: the resurrection of Jesus Christ. This event, which stands as the cornerstone of Christian faith, offers not just a story of rebirth but a beacon of hope that illuminates the darkest corners of human experience.

Living the Resurrection

Embracing the resurrection means more than celebrating a miraculous event; it involves living out its implications in our daily lives. We are called to carry the hope of resurrection into a world that is often marred by hopelessness. In our words, actions, and presence, we are to be beacons of hope, embodying the love, grace, and forgiveness that the resurrection signifies. 
